Founded in 1933, the BIS is the world's longest established organisation devoted to forwarding the utilisation of space.

The BIS has played a pivotal role in space development and policy with strong links to government, the UK Space Agency, industry and other space organisations.

- Providing conferences and policy inputs on key current topics such as Space Law and Regulation, space debris, reusable launch vehicles and spaceports.
- Running the UK's annual Sir Arthur Clarke Awards for space-related achievement on behalf of the Washington-based Arthur C. Clarke Foundation.
- Running technical projects to develop new possibilities from current technologies such as quarter-cube satellites and nanosat launch vehicles.
- Active in public outreach, as UK coordinator for the UN's World Space Week, organiser of its own events and supporter of shows like New Scientist Live.
- Promoting and supporting STEM education through Space applications and the development of a science and technology learning resources.

Access to the BIS Business Network has been designed to be obtainable by any and all players in the space industry, from start-up entrepreneurs and SMEs to multi-national corporations.


